QUICK FACTS: POVERTY IN LOUISIANA



Louisiana is the 49th poorest state in the country.



18.6% of the State of Louisiana, 829,565 individuals, live below the poverty level.



One in four children in the state live below the poverty level.



683,110 people in Louisiana live with food insecurity; 234,120 are children.



Outcomes of poverty include high maternal mortality rates, drug deaths, mental distress, safety concerns, crowded housing, high suicide rates, and much more.



QUICK FACTS: POVERTY IN SHREVEPORT-BOSSIER MSA

- SB A population of 389,155 reflects a 3.6% decline over the prior reporting year.
- SB 15.6% of families in the area live below the poverty level.
- SB Three in ten children under the age of five live below the poverty level.
- A medium household income of \$48,164 ranks the area's economic well-being 10th of 11 peer communities throughout the State of Louisiana.
- A household is considered cost-burdened when it spends more than 30% of its income on rent and utilities; 43.8% of local families are housing burdened.
